School Report

This school profile provides a comprehensive overview of **Mahmudkhoja Behbudiy Specialized STEM School(also called MBSI school)**. It outlines the school's academic and institutional framework, including its educational model, organizational structure, grading system, and assessment practices. The report also highlights student achievements, faculty and staff, learning facilities and resources, as well as major academic and school-wide initiatives developed through collaboration among students and educators.

Type of school: Specialized school

The primary distinction of **MBSI School** compared to regular secondary schools in Uzbekistan is its focused and rigorous STEM-oriented curriculum. The school emphasizes advanced instruction in Mathematics, Computer Science, Physics, and English, providing in-depth academic preparation for students with a strong interest in science, technology, and innovation.

Admission is open to students from across the country through a competitive entrance examination that evaluates mathematical proficiency, logical reasoning, analytical skills, and English language competency. From its inception, the school has maintained a selective admissions process, enrolling only students who meet high academic and language standards.

Uzbekistan's Education System & Our Specialization

Uzbekistan follows an **11-year compulsory education system**: **elementary** (1st–4th grades), **secondary** (5th–9th grades), and **high school** (10th–11th grades). After completing 4th grade, students may apply to specialized schools that offer advanced study in selected academic areas. At our school, the curriculum emphasizes in-depth instruction in Mathematics, Computer Science, Physics, and English, providing rigorous preparation in core STEM disciplines.

English Language of Instruction & Proficiency

At **MBSI School**, students receive full-time English instruction beginning in the final year of secondary education (Grade 9) and continuing through graduation. English is the language of instruction for all core academic subjects, including Mathematics, Computer Science, and Physics.

Academic Calendar

MBSI School follows a **semester-based academic calendar**. Students attend school 6 days per week, with **6 to 8 class periods per day**, each lasting **45 minutes**. Classes run from **8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.**, followed by extracurricular activities.

Standardized tests

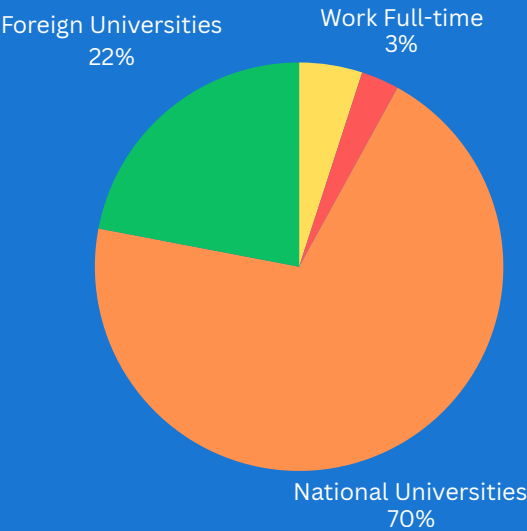

Extracurricular Activities

At **MBSI School**, students are encouraged to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities and student-led initiatives that complement academic learning. These opportunities span academic, technological, cultural, athletic, environmental, and community-focused areas, allowing students to explore diverse interests and develop leadership and collaborative skills.

Student Leadership

At **MBSI School**, student leadership is formally organized through **the School Presidency** and **the Student Council**, which operate in coordination with school administration. These bodies provide students with structured opportunities to participate in decision-making, organize school-wide initiatives, and contribute to the academic and extracurricular life of the school.

School Presidency

The School Presidency serves as the central student leadership body and is led by the **School President**, who is **elected through a school-wide student election**. Supported by elected student representatives, the Presidency works closely with the Student Council and school administration to coordinate major initiatives, oversee student-led projects, and represent student interests within the school community.

Student Council

The Student Council functions as an operational student governance body responsible for organizing activities across multiple departments. It is led by the **President** and **Vice President** and structured into specialized departments that manage different areas of student life.

Student Council Departments

Sports Department

- Organizes school sports activities, tournaments, and recreational events, promoting student participation, teamwork, and physical well-being.

Ecology Department

- Leads environmental awareness initiatives and sustainability-focused activities within the school community, encouraging responsible environmental practices.

Treasury (Finance) Department

- Oversees the financial administration of the Student Council. The Council operates with **a monthly budget of approximately 8 million UZS, fully funded by the school**, and managed by the **Treasurer** in coordination with the President and other council members. The department ensures transparent budgeting, responsible allocation of funds, and financial accountability.

Academic Affairs Department

- Coordinates academic-focused initiatives, including educational events, peer support activities, and projects that promote student engagement and academic development.

Information Technology (IT) Department

- Manages the technical and digital aspects of student activities, including event technology support, digital communication platforms, and IT-related student initiatives.

In addition to established student organizations, several new clubs have recently emerged, including the **Debate Club**, **Public Speaking Club**, and **Vocal Club**, further expanding opportunities for students to develop communication skills and engage in collaborative learning.
